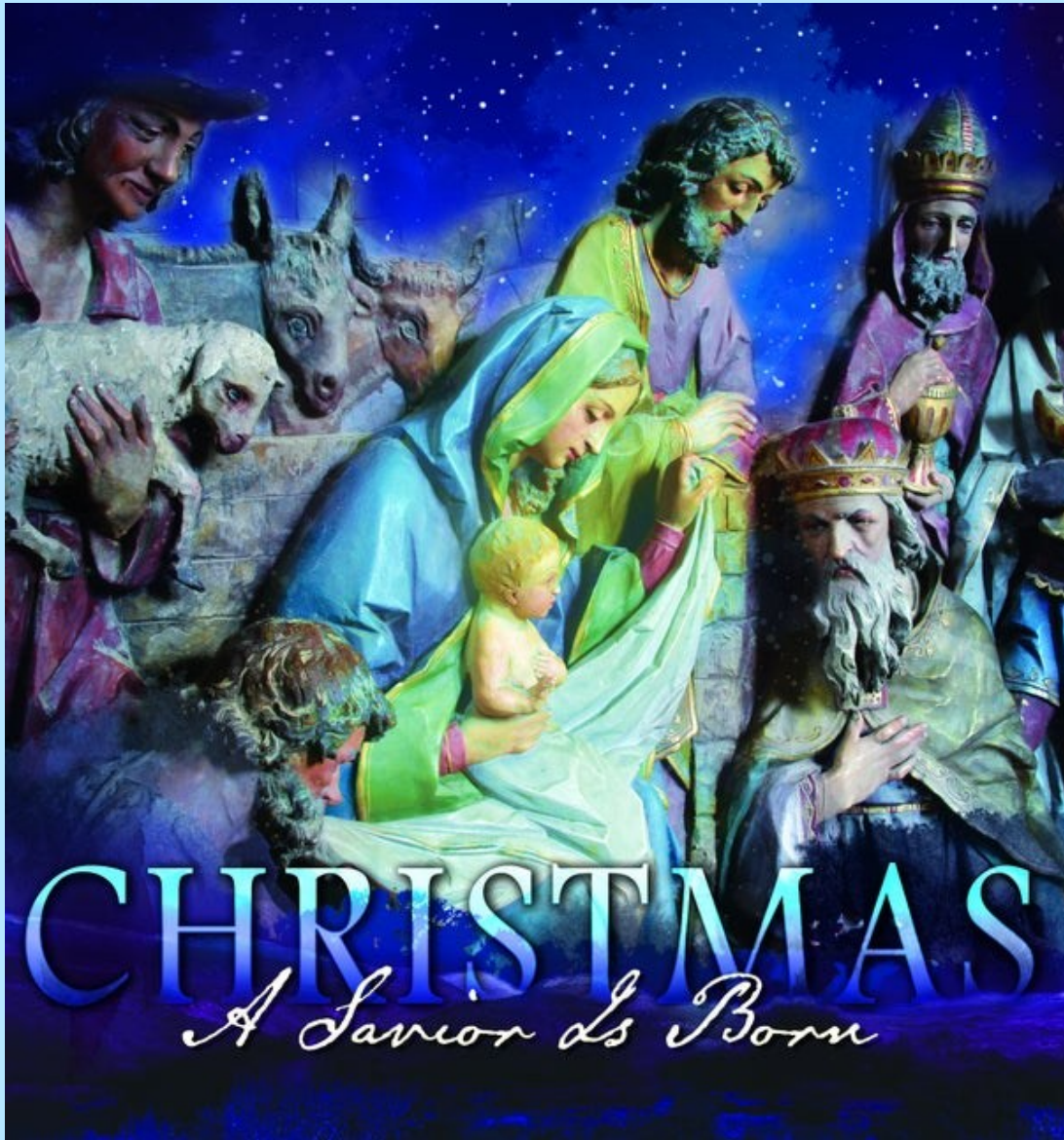

If you are joining us today for the first time, or if you are returning to church for the first time in a while, or you join us every weekend, welcome home. While you are here I hope you experience the joy and peace you're searching for this Christmas. On behalf of the entire pastoral and support staff of St. Mary's Parish I wish all of you and your families a Merry and Blessed Christmas.

The story of the first Christmas tells us how Joseph and Mary had to travel away from home adding to the already great challenge of Mary's pregnancy. Like the Holy Family, we too experience great challenges along our journey of faith. How do we respond to these challenges? Faced with great challenges Mary and Joseph continued their journey with great trust and hope and so were blessed to bear witness to the great Joy of a new born savior, Jesus Christ. We say, "they are removing Christ from Christmas." If it is truly important to us to keep the real meaning of Christmas, than it must start with us, in our own homes. In following Mary's example, making family and friends the priority this Christmas and by sharing the forgiveness God has first given to us we can truly live up to our mission of keeping Christ in Christmas.
